Charlotte White was the featured artist at Dagny's. She displayed several watercolor paintings of familiar buildings and places well-known to Bakersfield natives. The buildings were done with the skill, talent and detail that we associate with Charlotte.

At the members' meeting on April 8th, Phyllis Oliver made a presentation she titled "Taking a Risk with Watercolors". She had some of her gorgeous, colorful paintings on display. Using two identical paintings, she demonstrated how the use of different washes and stains will make each distinct from the other. As she stated, "If you take a painting far enough, it will teach you". It is evident how much she enjoys spontaneity and experimentation; she considers it a learning experience.

As a special treat she invited Norma Eaton who shared some secrets of her beautiful art. Norma stated that she had tried other mediums but prefers gouache. She described the difference between Phyllis and herself, saying Phyllis is more intuitive while she is a planner.

"Inner and Outer Space" is a 3-person art show of abstract art by Phyllis Oliver, Norma Eaton and Julie Fleming.

Phyllis has always been fascinated with the worlds that exist within the obvious. They are easy to miss unless one slows down and observes. Most often they are what people consider abstract and not real.

Norma does not usually work as an abstract artist, so this was a stretch for her. "I learned a lot about the essence of color, value and composition, and I had fun".

Julie's current passion is working in Acrylics with a pallet knife. Abstracts are a challenge, yet allow a sense of freedom not found in other subject.

WORKSHOP REPORT

(Marlene Meek, Chairperson)

Notes from Keith Wick's Workshop: Painting is a process, not a jigsaw puzzle. Think of it differently; start with the big shapes and end up with the smaller shapes. Begin with big brushes. Picture in your mind's eye the finished product. I am first concerned with the light and dark. Everything is about value. We are trying to be illusionists (if you want to paint Realism); it is our job to decide where we want the viewer's eye to go. To do this, you must learn to "pop" the color. You want to lead viewers into the painting, give them a way to get through and give them a payoff at the end of the journey. (Keith will often paint a red dot) Everything should be coming in at an angle. No stops. No roads coming down the middle of everything. How do you make paintings luminous? Think of color as light. When you dim the lights, dark colors go to black. Light colors appear brighter. Use transparent colors only in the darks you first lay down. The three most important things to keep in mind when you paint en plein air: 1. Composition/study the Masters; 2. Perspective/know it; 3. Harmony/keep colors in the same color range...many plein air painters tone their canvas with the complement of the dominant colors they will be using. Let some of the color peek through. In Keith's demonstration painting, he toned his canvas with yellow ochre and began drawing with raw sienna, one shade up. He put very few marks down to start, just a few dots and dashes. Then, with a large brush, he began laying in the transparent darks he had mixed. The middle values came next, then the lights and last the high lights. It works! We were amazed.

Next, <u>David Gordon</u>: Our last workshop before Summer break will be held on May 20th taught by David Gordon, Executive Director of the Arts Council of Kern and a highly acclaimed local artist. David's workshop will be on "Painting the Urban & Rural Landscape". A flyer with details of the event will be available at our May meeting on the 13th where he will present the program. Cost of the workshop will




be \$65 for members and \$75 for non-members using oil or acrylic.

David will lead the class step-by-step, through a painting using values before color. The first half of the day will be getting the values blocked in and differentiating between depth, light, warmth and cools before color. He will concentrate on the importance of the foundation of a work of art before the layering of color. If you have struggled with values or continuity of a piece, this is the



workshop for you. Color will be added in the second half of the class and only sparingly, mixing it with the neutral values to make sure the piece has continuity and the correct atmosphere to communicate depth and sense of place.


